

The practice tests were by far the most helpful part of my LSAT prep. There was no substitute for practicing on real tests, where you can time yourself, practice the endurance of a complete test, etc. If you are serious about getting a good score on the LSAT, you are going to need to take at least 20 of these bad boys. Definitely focus on the latest tests for the best idea of what to expect on your test day.

The magic happens when you put what you've learned into practice with actual tests. Buy these, take them under perfectly simulated conditions (even find the testing room if you can), review them extensively to understand your mistakes, and kill it on test day. Between the 2 times I took the LSAT, I went through approximately 50 PTs. This prep had everything to do with my 97th and 99th percentile scores.

I'm the moderator of Reddit's LSAT forum, and I recommend this book to all my students.LSAT 66 introduced a change: logic games are now on two pages, instead of one. Until LSAT 67 is released, this is the \*only\* LSAT that shows you the new format. The way the new logic games are setup, the left hand page has the rules, and the first question. The right hand page has all the other questions. I recommend drawing your diagram on the second page, so that it's closer to most of the questions and easier to use.
