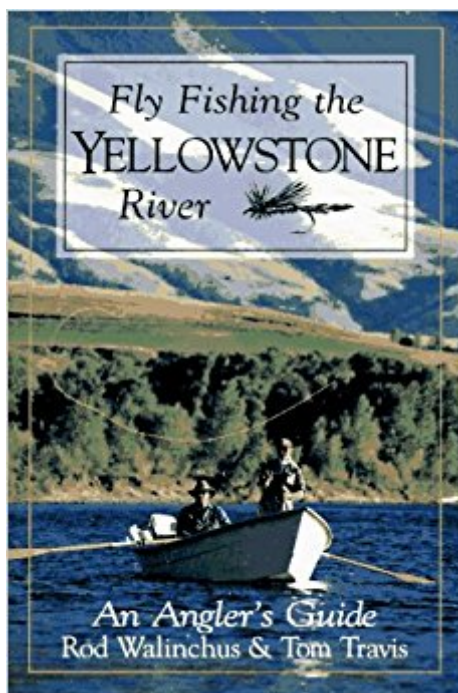

It's true this book was first published in mid-90s and is now out of print. However, this book still brightly shines as the true guide for The Might Yellowstone = an ever-changing freestone river, as the longest un-dammed river in the Lower 48 states. Why? - Though said "ever-changing", sections, accesses, towns, majority of hatches, and many other broad topics still hold the same if not close/similar. Authors are not mentioning to fish certain channels for particular hatches either. - Each technique in this book will never fade away!! and can be applied to other waters that you fish!! - Hatch charts with both English & Latin names are very useful. Also various other aquatic food sources (such as sculpin, minnow, etc) are also deeply discussed along with how to fish with them. - I can't emphasize how useful this book is when talking about sections of this BIG river. In this book, the river is divided into palatable pieces to understand one by one and practical length to cover & fish for a day. These are because it's written by working guides. - Each chapter = section is followed by a hatch chart. Then knowledge and techniques that can be most relevant for the chapter. However, if you read through, you will understand that knowledge and techniques of each chapter can be applied to another section above and below. Very well-organized. - As for publications, I don't

think there's any other books that are solely dedicated to Yellowstone River and covering from Yellowstone Park Headwater to majority of Montana sections (down to Billings). And the last but not the least, - Master Angler Tom Travis is still on the River and I happen to be one of his apostles.....
