

You feel as if you're on the battlefield with the Marines and Army, sharing the difficult times in a dangerous place. True heroism is common, but the politics of military brass, who may have been indirectly helping the enemy is atrocious, if not criminal. The battlefield was clearly described by the author who did an amazing job of calling in air strikes to protect his Brothers.

It is simply an excellent book. It is not just about war, it goes further. The books deeps in the complexities of the war, what soldiers (marines) think, how the strong bonds of brotherhood are formed between members of Dagger 22, how the rules of engagement meant to protect the civilians and the soldiers, increments the possibilities to get themselves killed. Michael writes the book in a way where every reader can understand, you don't need to be a soldier to understand and comprehend the stories. He tells with naturalism what happened in Bala Mughrab Valley and the story evolves itself, involving the reader in the story. Es simplemente un excelente libro. First, as a former operator and Force Recon Marine, I am naturally attracted to this type of story. I found it authentic, fun, and exciting. I think US citizens should read this type of material to gain an understanding of the huge sacrifices, made on their behalf, in the ever expanding asymmetrical battlespace. More and more, boots on the ground will really be all about specially-trained, courageous, and committed special operations Marines, soldiers, airmen, and sailors. This is not the breed we have read about for so many years that have been lionized in stories. These brave souls can shape a battlespace that is profound, and through better senior leadership more meaningfully, than is possible with ordinairy enlistees. Can you say, "more bang for the buck"? A statement like that draws ire from traditional "leg" command elements. Mostly from those who don't like the word "special" attached to the SPECIAL warriors or because this fundamental change shrinks their budgets and/or relevance. They are quick to criticize that which they don't have the ability to do nor the courage to attempt. I highly recommend this book.

Golembesky hit a home run with this one. In the beginning I enjoyed reading about his perspective coming into MARSOC and being thrown onto a team as an outsider (he was a JTAC, not an operator). Also how he navigated the very close-knit team dynamic he encountered during the work up, and how he had to prove himself worthy to the guys. The author strikes me as an introverted, reflective, deeply compassionate warrior who has a strong moral base and it showed in his writing. At times in the book it was all I could do but shake my head at the TYPICAL bone-headed officers who haven't a clue about combat and put people's lives at risk ignorantly. The WORST type of officer you can have leading a unit in combat is one worried about his next promotion. In all, an outstanding tribute to all the warriors we have lost in the Bala Murghab Valley. If it weren't for guys like Golembesky and his brothers doing such skilled work surely they would have taken a lot more casualties. Hey Ski, Semper Fi brother.

This book is well written and easy to read. The author is articulate and his account of the experience in BM is riveting. It paints a detailed picture of the extremes endured by our troops in theater as well

as a respectful but truthful account of the immense dangers burdened upon them by out-of-touch General staff. The same General Staff whom are more interested in their post-military political careers than they are with serving our country and leading the men and women whose lives they are entrusted with.
