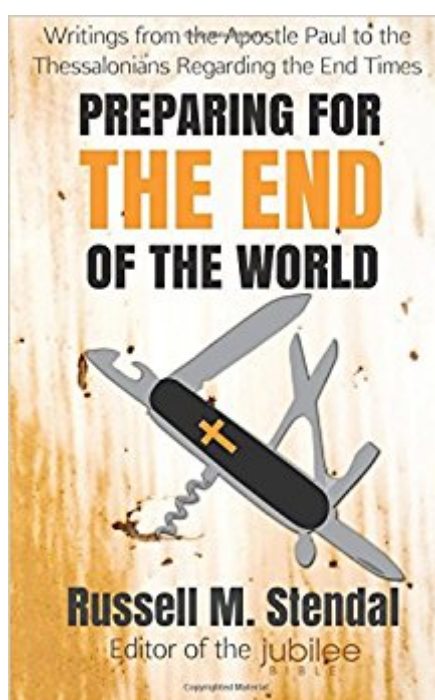

I downloaded this book for free today and read it through in just an hour. It is very well written commentary on I and II Thessalonians and gives Christians a lot to think about. I admire Russell for his service to Christ in Columbia, and also for his world wide ministry. I agree with his general interpretation of both epistles to the Thessalonians as it applies to the behavior of Christians who comprise the Church. He takes a conservative position and he is very much concerned about the tolerance of sin and the lack of holy living among those who claim to be believers but do little to "crucify the flesh." Where I disagree with Russell is in his interpretation of eschatology as delineated in these epistles of Paul to the Thessalonians. He does not believe in a pre-tribulation rapture of the Church, and he considers that such a belief necessarily leads Christians to live carnal lives. I believe he is wrong on both counts. Russell never describes the Great Tribulation in his book as it is described in the Book of Revelation, because it is not in harmony with his notion of what the true Saints will have to endure. So he takes the Tribulation rather symbolically for the experience all

Christians have in living their lives as opposed to a period of seven years in which world wide cataclysmic events will occur as the wrath of God is brought to bear against a world that has forsaken His grace in sending Christ into the world to redeem sinners. I could go on, but you get the idea. I still think it is a worthwhile read just to compare the pre-Trib rapture perspective to his non-Tribulation/no rapture interpretation to convince yourself about what the Bible actually says on this most important subject. I also think what he has to say about holy living is of paramount importance today. I respect Russell for the hard work he has done in studying the Scriptures to arrive at his own conclusions and I do not think that his doctrine will keep him out of heaven. Indeed we will all be surprised when we see how it is actually all played out at the last day as the LORD has given us so much to digest and try to harmonize end time events from His Holy Word of Truth in both the Old and New Testaments.
