

This is not a beginner's book of how to projects, but it is a very down to earth guide to metalsmithing, covering all important details. The spiral binding is a wonderful touch, so you can lay the book flat, to read while working. The only glitch comes in the final portion covering gemstones, which perhaps the author should have skipped. There are several errors and misleading things in that section (e.g., advice to put oil on opals? Yikes!), the only mar to an otherwise excellent book.
