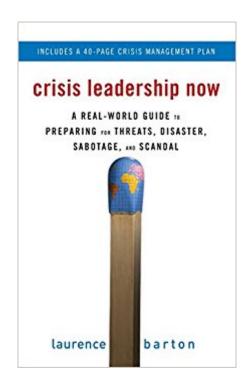


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# Crisis Leadership Now: A Real-World Guide To Preparing For Threats, Disaster, Sabotage, And Scandal (Management & Leadership)

Most businesses, schools, city halls, warehouses, etc. will never have someone walk in with an automatic rifle or a bomb and threaten to kill everyone inside, but over 8,000 TIMES A DAY an assault takes place in the workplace. What I think is even worse than physical confrontation is the employee who scares everyone else on a daily basis and management feels incapable of taking action "because he hasn't REALLY done anything, YET." I have been involved in Dr. Barton's

seminars and I am very pleased with his new book. In addition to his seminars, Dr. Barton is a key advisor to companies big and small who helps them assess and appropriately act on threats to the company and its' employees. He has real world, real time experience that is matched by few people in the world and his book shares his vast knowledge and expertise. Sadly, when it comes to mental health the social landscape has changed. In the past people who were unhappy, unstable, or both would deal with his/her situation privately and sometimes tragically. For employees, this book may be frustrating if you're in a company that is blissfully ignorant of this information. It may just confirm your fears that your employer is not adequately prepared for business in the 21st century. Unfortunately, there are real consequences to this type of ignorance and it is measured in dollars and lives. Dr. Barton has a unique approach in helping others understand today's workplace and this book is the reality check that every organization needs to avoid the unthinkable.
