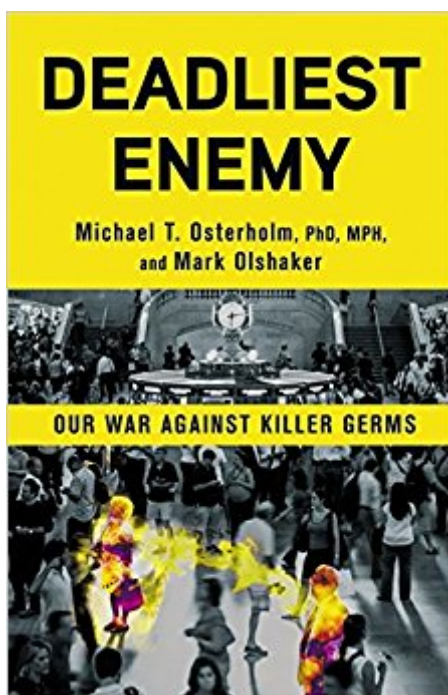

As a local public health professional I have been following Dr. Osterholm's work for several years. I have always been impressed by his ability to highlight challenges in public health. I picked up his book expecting more war stories from an amazing career in public health. *Deadliest Enemy* provides far more than that. It's clearly the magnum opus of this public health professional. The book goes into the infectious disease challenges facing the future of the world based on the vantage point of a veteran infectious disease hunter. Those challenges are laid out in a framework that clearly prioritizes the issues.
