

Doris Gates was a librarian and writer of children's fiction. Blue Willow was groundbreaking in its use of realistic storytelling for children. Doris Gates is also known for her collections of Greek mythology, including A Fair Wind for Troy.

I ordered this older story because it was the first full book I read as a child. It is set during the depression, and the story of a young girl with an uncertain future moving around the country with her migrant worker father. If you liked OUT OF THE DUST, this story is great. If you are a young person, as a teacher, I highly recommend it as a book review for English. It is a pleasant and easy read!

This is a very gentle story ... a little multi-cultural, a little dust bowl history ... a little family relationships ... I'm not sure I would agree that it is the "young version of The Grapes of Wrath"... but it is worth a discussion in a classroom.
