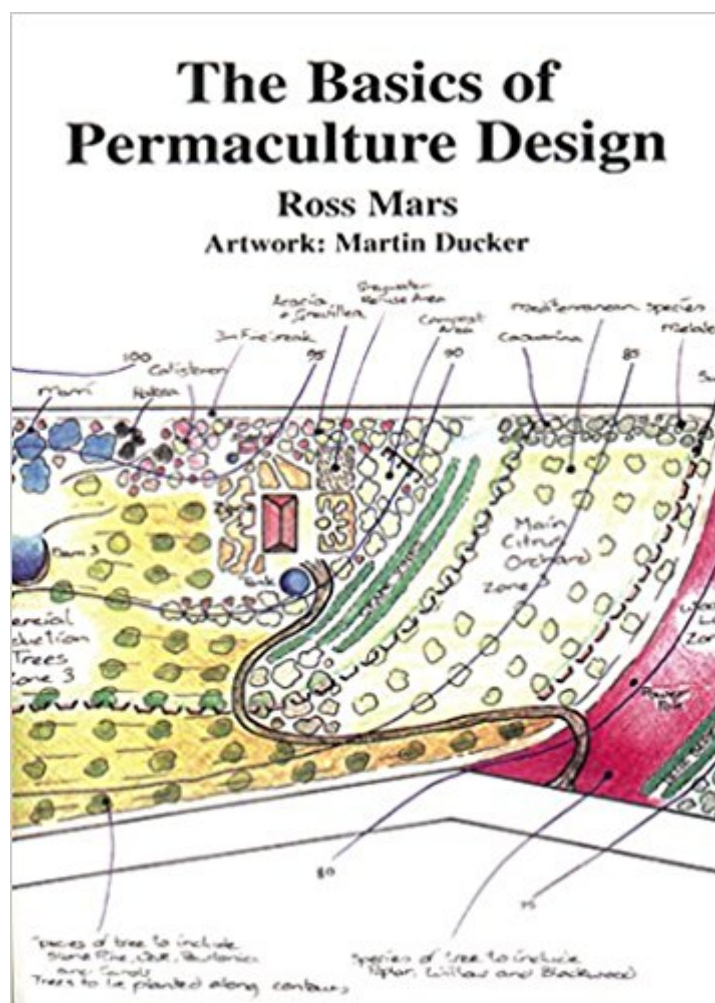

He is the author of the well known text *The Basics of Permaculture Design* and has also produced an educational video on energy efficient housing called *Passive Solar Design of Buildings*.
