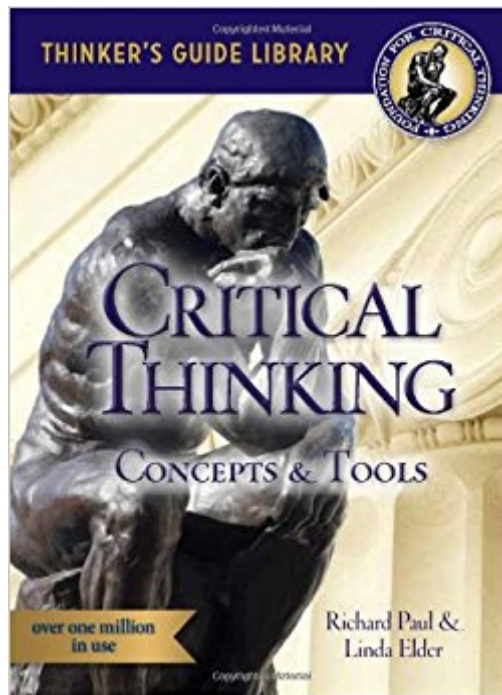


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The Miniature Guide To Critical Thinking-Concepts And Tools (Thinker's Guide)

They apply them in history, science, math, philosophy, and the arts; in professional and personal life.

The Miniature Guide to Critical Thinking is a fine "primer" or beginning to the study of critical thinking. The study of critical thinking can be applied to almost any facet of modern day life, especially those areas that can or must be analyzed. There are more in-depth books on the subject but for someone interested in exploring a very big subject for a very small price, you can't go wrong with this book. A few examples of detailed rational analysis applications would have earned this book five stars, but I consider that a small drawback. Even if your university curriculum doesn't require this small book, you should get it regardless. It will be tremendously helpful in developing your initial critical thinking skills, and those are skills that can be used every day.

So this book is more of a pamphlet than an actual book. The content that it does have is quite nice. However, this book is essentially useless as pretty much everything can be found online on various websites for free. This was listed as a class requirement for me. Don't believe it.

I enjoyed reading the text in preparation for a writing course I will be teaching. It reinforced what I already knew and provided me with a launchpad from which to begin creating critical thinkers.

I thought this was a normal book - its actually just a tiny pamphlet. That was disappointing. However, the content inside is solid - very well thought out and communicated clearly. I think it would have been much more effective as a small book instead of such a tiny guide.

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
