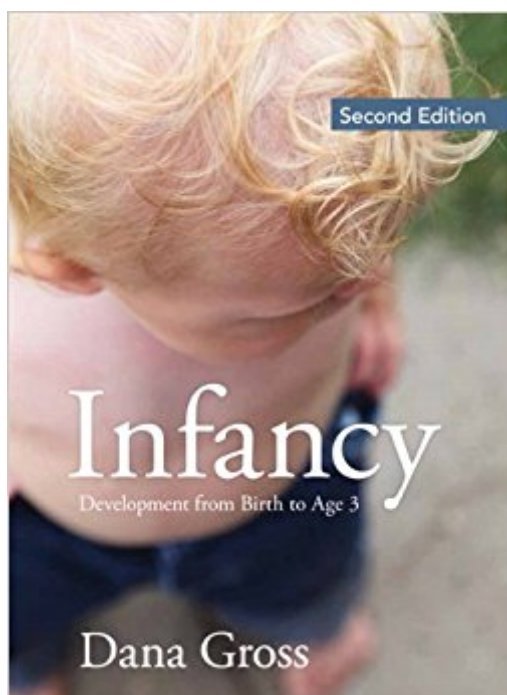


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# Infancy: Development From Birth To Age 3 (2nd Edition)
