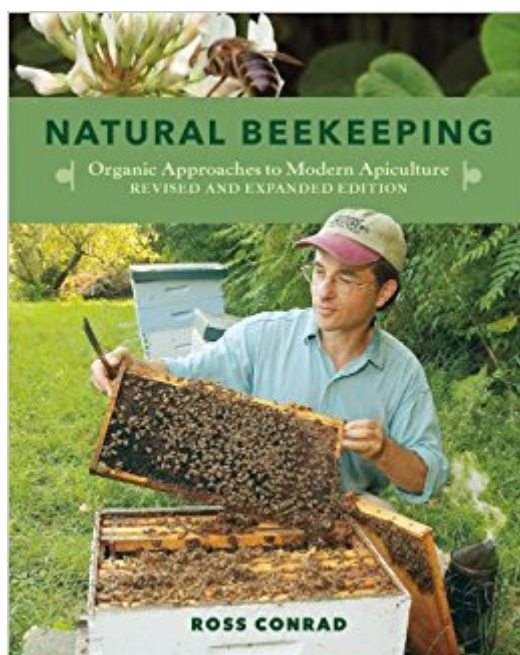

Ross Conrad learned his craft from the late Charles Mraz, world-renowned beekeeper and founder of Champlain Valley Apiaries in Vermont. Former president of the Vermont Beekeepers Association, Conrad is a regular contributor to *Bee Culture* and *The Magazine of American Beekeeping*. He has led bee-related presentations and taught organic beekeeping workshops and classes throughout North America for many years. His small beekeeping business, Dancing Bee Gardens, supplies friends, neighbors, and local stores with honey and candles, among other bee related products, and provides bees for Vermont apple-pollination in spring.

As a beekeeper that has only one year under my belt, I found this book had some interesting information. It is more philosophical than practical. That's fine if it is philosophy you are looking for. If you are looking for practical nuts and bolts information on how to raise bees organically, this is not the book for you.

While the author seems to be a little 'preachy' at times about the "evils" of industrial beekeeping, he does provide an EXCELLENT resource for handling bees in a more natural and non-chemical way. He focuses on essential oils and 'soft' treatments. The best part of this book is that he explains WHY things work biologically.I would recommend that any new beekeeper first purchase the "dummies" book, read it, and then purchase this book as well. It fills in gaps that I didn't even know that I had in my knowledge base.

the hives are transported all over the country. Small, well trained beekeepers are needed. This book address many of the problems, but I do not believe there is any good solution to the many problems facing bees. Research needs to be done. Natural solutions need to be found before it is too late. We all need to work together to keep the population of bees alive until solutions are found. This is a good book and a good place to start the education needed to keep and protect bees.

This is a very well-written approach to a more organic way to keep bees. It gives some practical and inexpensive ideas on treating various bee pathogens and vectors without resorting to harmful chemicals. Very helpful to those of us who want a more harmonious and natural path.

I bought this book for reference after checking out a whole bunch of bee books at the library. I felt this one had the most useful information for me. I don't want to use a lot of chemicals, so the natural approach to beekeeping was the best for me. It also has an interesting recipe for 'bee tea,' which is a sugar water feed for the bees when they can't get to nectar and pollen. If I could only have one bee book, this would be it. It has methods of pest control, diseases and infestations, what a healthy hive should look like, potential problems, lots of pictures of the bees in the hive, queen ideas, and much much more
