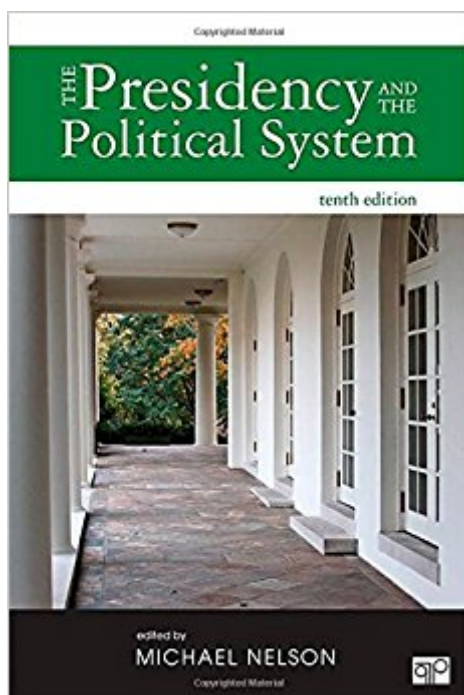

I had to read this book for a political course at Johns Hopkins University. The book includes a series of carefully analyzed historical references which aid in the understanding of the executive branch as it evolved over the course of American history. The substantive growth in the executive is explained to be either a direct cause of electorate discontent with a sporadic legislative branch as well as growing factors by previous presidents to expand power based on the ambiguity in Article II of the Constitution. There's more to it as well, of course, although I would not want to give everything away. This is a wonderful book for anyone trying to understand the power of the executive/President, especially how that power has changed and evolved over time.
