

Rick Steves has spent 100 days every year since 1973 exploring Europe. Rick produces a public television series (Rick Steves Europe), a public radio show (Travel with Rick Steves), and an app and podcast (Rick Steves Audio Europe); writes a bestselling series of guidebooks and a nationally syndicated newspaper column; organizes guided tours that take thousands of travelers to Europe annually; and offers an information-packed website (RickSteves.com). With the help of his hardworking staff of 80 at Rick Steves Europe, Inc. in Edmonds, Washington, just north of Seattle; Rick's mission is to make European travel fun, affordable, and culturally broadening for Americans.

Great little guide, small and light. Doesn't cover everything but very helpful. Listening to Rick Steves' audio tracks through his app (I found out about them from this guide) are also really helpful (you can download them at home and be off-line while listening).

We used this book as we traveled through Europe. I carried it all day while in Vienna. It gives great information on just about everything you need to know. I read it at home, highlighted what I thought we should see, where we should eat, stay, visit, and buy. He gives so many tips that you just wouldn't think of. He also gives you a brief description on almost everything you will want to see. I often pulled out the book and read it out loud to my group as we stood in front of monuments.

What can I say other than buy the book. I traveled extensively throughout this wonderful city and the book came in handy. I never been to a cleaner nicer big city than Vienna. It's definitely a must travel to destination.

Nice small size but lacks too much info. Purchased Vienna, Salzburg & Tirol which provides more info.

I had 2.5 days in Vienna, and this worked great for that. It's compact and concise, and I felt did a great job of helping me find some of the "must-sees." If I was there for longer, I'd probably want something with a bit more depth.

A tiny bit outdated. Prices for some attractions are a few euros higher now. But good suggestions and great maps. We tried some of the restaurant suggestions and were not disappointed. Values he puts on restaurants are usually correct. Only disagreement on his take was the Mozart museum. We think the museum has been updated and we loved it. But overall a solid briefing on Vienna. And we agree. The Danube is definitely not blue. But the lunch in the restaurant by the boat docks was great!

The main Vienna sights are covered fine by this book, although there are english audio guides at the venues for some of the tours in the book. We missed the walking tours and neighborhood info that we liked in the Rome pocket guide. Also the Melk/Krems info is better in the larger book for Austria. We bought the Lonely Planet Vienna book while we were in the city because it had better info.

I confess I am addicted to Rick Steves books. Before each of our trips I look and buy nearly every tourist book, but Rick Steves books always have special value - you know what to visit first, the hours when it is open what to see + history. And the best thing is his audio tours!!!

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
