

Oh my gosh, what a joy this was to read! Jody Gehrman is now on my "Authors to Watch" list and as soon as I'm done typing, I'm going to cyber stalk her to see what she's writing next! Okay, maybe "Stalking" is a little strong, but you get my point. So the premise noted for the book does a pretty good job of summing up the plot. Actually, when I popped open the book I was half expecting to read something similar to that cheesy 80's flick Just One of The Guys (for those of you who haven't

seen it, you're not missing much). Thankfully, this novel never degenerating into that madcap, hokey, over the top kind of cliched story. In fact, it was charming and hysterical and, at times, very poignant.Nat/Natalie was a wonderful character, as were her BFF's Chloe and Darcy, and her love interest Emilio. Each individual character had a distinct voice that was all their own and even the peripheral characters were endearing and charming. I could not recommend this book more. My only caveat is, there is occasional strong language. While this doesn't bother me, it may not be appropriate for the under 16 ilk.

This book was a serious pleasure to read. I really admire Jody's writing style. At times she can be so poetic. I kept finding myself rereading sentences and smiling at their simple and clever beauty. Her writing alone makes her novels likable. I did, however, notice at times that Natalie Rowan (the protag) didn't sound as distinctly like a seventeen year old as she did at other times. This was easily written off after I remembered that not all teenage girls are the same. I still couldn't help but cringe when he used a word or phrase I couldn't imagine knowing when I was seventeen. And still don't know. It was educational if nothing else and I got to spend a little time bonding with my dictionary and with wikipedia. I give this book a five star rating because I had so much fun reading it. I loved the fast pace, Natalie's friends (the male and female ones), Emilio!, and I really loved vicariously being a guy for a week with her. Though I was raised by two men (my dad and bro) and I have a fairly good understanding of the male gender, I really enjoyed watching Natalie discover what I've already discovered. I have to admit I was a little nervous to read the ending of this book because I wasn't

Another reason I gave this book a five star review was because Natalie and I have so much in common.
