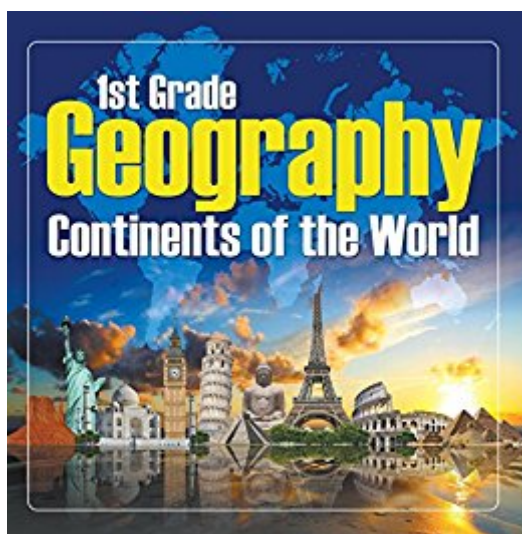


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# 1st Grade Geography: Continents Of The World: First Grade Books (Children's Explore The World Books)

It is short and concise which is very appropriate for a 1st Grade audience. We are in the digital age and for this reason tablets are nearly accessible in many classrooms in the United States. I would have this book available to my 1st graders to read in the classroom. The only reason I didn't give it 5 Stars is because it is slightly lacking in the "WOW" factor. It dedicates a page to each continent and explains a popular place in relation to the Country that is outlined on the previous page. For example, The Eiffel Tower is well known for being in Europe. The one fact that I did learn that I was

I received 1st Grade Geography: Continents of the World: First Grade Book in exchange for an honest review. So here are my thoughts about this book. To start I would give this book 4 out of 5 stars. I feel that this book can be enjoyed from ages 5 to 10. It is an easy read, the writing is simple so kids will be able to read the book without a problem. The book is not too long and it does a great job with keeping the reader interested so you don't want to stop reading. I feel the book really reached out and tells the story the author is trying to tell. An example of this is when the book talks about a continent the author talks about a special place that is only for that continent. That was my kid's favorite part of the book. They even went to the computer to look up more information about those special places listed on the continent. It was nice to see that they still wanted more information after we were thru with the book. I would say I would have liked to have a little bit more information in the book, but using the computer afterwards made up for it. Overall I would recommend this book. It is an easy enjoyable book.

This book is available for download to your Kindle/tablet. It is 18 pages of colorful pictures telling facts about each continent and highlighting a special place found there. The pictures are stunning and the content is simple and easy to understand. I love that each continent is displayed in map form making it easy for students to identify. I wish the author would have shown a global pictures so students see where the continents are in relation to one another. Just like the other books in this series, it is missing nonfiction features of text that would really aid in comprehension, for example I would have expected the word currency to have been written in bold and added to a glossary with a simple, kid friendly definition. For my ESL students is a great way to teach them some of the famous places that they may see featured in American movies and read about in literature. I received this book at a discount in exchange for my honest review.

Of all the books I have purchased from Baby Professor this is the one I was most excited to see. I do not teach 1st grade, the title implying that this story is most suitable for those in that age range, but reviewing the seven continents is one of the skills that is covered yearly in my second grade classroom. I feel as if I have plenty of books discussing each continent individually, but none that briefly discuss each continent in one book. First of all, if you are a fan of the oxford comma like I am

you will notice that it's missing in this book. Not a huge deal, but something I took note of as I was reading. I really enjoyed how the author explained that the continents were 7 large land masses although I would like to point out that, in my eyes, the world is created of six large land masses and the divide between Europe and Asia is a cultural one rather than a physical one. However, those are my issues and most readers would likely see a well-written explanation of our Earth's continents. Some words you may want to review if you are reading this with young children are populous, terrain, and climate. Despite having some trickier vocabulary I still find this book to be highly appropriate for early elementary aged students. I think they will be drawn to the simple text, interesting pictures, and, best of all, the maps I've been hoping to find in some of the companion books.
