

This book has lots of interesting cultural information. It is helpfully broken down into regional sections. The map that comes along with it looks comprehensive.But if you're looking for a guide for transportation and lodging, you'll have to look elsewhere. It has a sentence on about 3 hotels per region. But I think that's probably how it is meant to be used, to give details to go with your other book.

Good concise guide book that gives just enough information to allow you to choose what you will be interested in enough to stay interested. Were able to read the entire book before our trip. It gave us all we needed to supplement our hop on hop off bus excursion.

We visited Malta for 5 days and this guide was perfect. It is well organized and tells you enough to help you select where you wish to go without confusing you with unnecessary details.

This book arrived well within the time promised. Has all the info you'll need on Malta, plus a great companion map.

A very attractive guidebook with a protective vinyl sleeve and an oversized map, all of which adds to the cost and is unnecessary. This edition may be a little out of date for a Fall 2014 trip as I have, due to a publishing date of August 2013, but no matter on this account as I do not stay at the fancy hotels, eat the fancy food, and attend the fancy bars and eateries. My main objection to its use is that the print is too small throughout for easy accessibility even though I have good, corrected sight. The tiny print on portions of maps in the guidebook is outrageously small, requiring at least a 2x magnifying glass (yes, I used one). The large scale map is far too large scale, requiring a good size table or floor to see all of one side. Because much of the islands are very sparsely occupied with towns and villages and because some large scale is necessary for the streets of the two largest communities, different scales would be far more appropriate than the one scale or all. This map has a US price of \$16.99, certainly not what the publisher of the guide book paid, but this map with its flimsy paper was far overpriced whatever was paidAlso, I am not so sure of the accuracy of the editing, as the last words before the index do not make a complete sentence. Was anything of importance omitted? Are there other editing problems of which the reader is unaware. Finally, I had difficulty locating the international airport on the map. I had to search the guidebook for more time than I wished to spend in order to determine that Luqa, the site of it (which I knew), was located in the "South" geography of the guidebook. I then had to search that portion of the map to find the airport. A far better way would be for the guide book to have a small scale map along side its description of Luga, which shows the location of that miniscule community in relation to Tas-Sliema and Valetta, the two largest communities into which almost all tourists have as destinations.

This guide and excellent map served the need well.Recommended
